**Macoupin County**-In an effort to help local coal miners who recently lost their jobs due to the closures of Monterey Coal Mine and the Crown II Mine, Macoupin County has joined with several local and state partners to present a job skills and career workshop on Feb. 21 from 8 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. at the Activities Center at the Lake Williamson Christian Retreat Center.

"The workshop presented in September after the closure of Crown II Mine was well attended and we received positive feedback from the coal miners," said Macoupin County Board Chairman Andrew Manar.

"With that in mind, we decided we should have a second workshop to help not only the Monterey Coal Miners, but anyone who has been affected by layoffs in our region. Thanks to the agencies partnering with the County, I feel the workshop will provide some valuable resources to those attending."
