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Depending on who you talk to there are varying opinions on the value of townships. According to Tim Peters with IDOT, in 2022 it was calculated there were 16,403 county road miles and 72,527 township road miles. The county roads total one quarter the number of township road miles in the state of Illinois. Townships have the ability to accomplish the daily needs of road work with fewer resources to exemplify efficiency. This confirms the need for township government. These roads could not be maintained as well as they are without township governments and our neighbors in need could not get a hand up in times of financial need.

South Otter Township has monthly meetings and anyone is welcome to attend. The dates are posted on the building so they are visible to all in the community. In this act we have been tasked with taking a good look at our township effectiveness.
