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- VI Over the past several decades, we have the best roads in the county while remaining within our budget every year. We built a maintenance shed to house our road equipment to keep a presence in the community of Hagaman. This year, we are adding an office/town hall onto the maintenance shed. We are also working with Henderson Rural Water to bring water to our community.
- VII. Our biggest obstacle is the lack of communication networks. To have the ability to communicate with township residents, we need better cell and internet service. In our community, it is essential to have telecommunications networks available for emergencies as well as the ability to reach out to our constituents. As of current date, reception is nil to poor. Steps we can take is to reach out to cellular companies and local internet providers to see if a tower(s) can be erected in the town of Hagaman to get people the service they need.
- VIII. Township government is the oldest existing unit of government continuing to serve on the North American continent. Township government was in existence for 140 years prior to the signing of the Declaration of Independence in 1776. The wording of the Declaration of Independence reflects the fact that 38 of its 56 signers had experienced the benefits of township government. The Declaration's statement that "government should derive its just powers from the consent of the governed" is demonstrated at the Annual Town Meeting. (reference from Township Officials of Illinois) Townships are a "grassroots" government that provides services to our neighbors and communities.
